- **Brief history of the College**

Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, a constituent college of University of Delhi, was established in 1951 and is maintained by Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee (DSGMC), a statutory body established under an act of the Parliament of India. The college started in a school building in Dev Nagar and shifted to its present premises in North Campus in 1973. The focus of the College at the time of inception was to ensure a comprehensive social transformation through access to quality education, in particular to young Punjabi Refugees of Partition in 1947, and to conserve and promote Punjabi language, culture, and heritage. The College is named after Ninth Guru - Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur, who sacrificed his life to uphold secular values, and is an institution with cosmopolitan environment and progressive outlook.

- **Major Activities and Achievements**

- In the academic year 2022-2023, our college prioritized academic excellence and cultural enrichment. Commencing on July 20th, 2022, the session embraced the National Education Policy-2020, fostering a transformative educational experience. A highlight was the International Sikh Congress from January 5th to 7th, 2023, dedicated to documenting Sikh history and contributions to India, graced by Lt. Gen. Gurmit Singh and Prof. Yogesh Singh. On September 9th, 2022, a felicitation program was held to honour Padma Shri awardee S. Vikramjit Singh Sahney. Academic discourse continued with an August 8th, 2022 national seminar on the Partition of India and Sikh role in freedom. In sports, the 9th Sahibzada Zorawar Singh and Sahibzada Fateh Singh T20 cricket tournament in 2023 was inaugurated by Dr. Ravi Chaturvedi. Tradition persisted with the Founders Day on November 26th, honouring the martyrdom of the Ninth Sikh Guru, Tegh Bahadur Sahib ji. The students of our college showed exemplary performance in academics and sports. The GAD-TLC hosted 86 events attracting 12,316 participants nationwide. The promotions and recruitments for teaching faculty were conducted. These collective efforts reflect the college's commitment to holistic education, cultural celebration, and intellectual engagement.

- **Library Development**

- The College Library possesses the finest collection of reading material among the various institutions in the University Campus. It is equipped with 145642 books of all disciplines on record and regular subscription of Indian journals; magazines and daily newspapers. It caters the needs of the students at Undergraduate and Postgraduate level to support research and learning. The library services are automated. The Annual General Budget of the Library for the period of (2022-2023) was the sum of Rupees 11, 80,000 (Rupees Eleven Lakh Eighty Thousand Only). 1251 books were added to the library in the session 2022-2023. The library has gate security check system with 32 CCTV cameras installed to monitor. The library is connected with Delhi University wide area campus networking system and provides access to Electronic Resources to its users from Delhi University Library System (DULS) and UGC-INFONET Consortium. Library subscribed to 7 journals, 28 Magazines and 27 Newspaper. Two permanent Library Attendant has been appointed on 07 November, 2022. Library has a separate section of 8000 classics and other reference books on Sikh studies. The College Library is a member of UGC N-LIST consortium and Library members can have access of online journals, ebooks etc. within and outside the library premises and even at home. Orientation Programme is conducted at the commencement of new academic session every year. Students were oriented towards library for its collection, services, and facilities etc. in batches. N-LIST demo classes twice in a week to train the students with e-resources and also collect the feedback. Library Internship Programme: Two Library Science students have been recruited as Internee for one month in the College Library. They have been trained to work in all sections of the Library. New Arrival List: The list of the new books added to the library is prepared on the computer and is displayed in the reading hall periodically for the Information of the users. Question Bank and Syllabus: Library provides previous year scanned question papers and syllabus of various subjects for consultation and Xerox. The library is computerized and books are bar-coded and made easily accessible through OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). College provides access to Internet in the

Library Reading Room for the students and the staff during college hours. The library preserves all the editions of the college magazine "THE TEGH" with the first edition published in 1953.
