Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, a leading institution of higher education within the University of Delhi, was founded in 1951 with a mission to provide education to the Partition refugees. It began as a modest institution in Dev Nagar, Karol Bagh, New Delhi, with its first cohort of students appearing for Delhi University examinations in 1952. As the college expanded, it relocated to University Enclave, Delhi, in 1971. The foundation stone was laid in 1973 by Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then PM of the nation. Since then, the college has reached unimaginable heights.

Values

The college is found on the legacy of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib. His sacrifice earned him the title of *Hind-di-Chadar* (Protector of India's spirit of secularism) and defined Human Rights and Social Justice for the ages to come. The concept of *mar-jeevda*–one who first accepts death as a reality and then lives a life of fearless dignity–ignited a spirited commitment towards the human rights. This teaching is foundation of the college's value system.
