ABOUT THE COLLEGE

SRI GURU TEGH BAHADUR KHALSA COLLEGE (University of Delhi)

Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College is a constituent College of the University Of Delhi. It is situated in the Worth Campus of the city. The College is named after the Ninth Guru, Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur, whose sacrifice and martyrdom for secular values is unique in the annals of history. SGTB Khalsa College is a co- educational institution established in the year 1951. The College is managed by the Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee. It draws inspiration from the life of the Guru and attempts to instil ideals of self-sacrifice and service among the youth. The College had a modest beginning and was situated in four rooms in a school in Dev Nagar with 49 students and a faculty of 6 teachers. The College shifted to its present premises in the university campus in 1973.

The College has produced some of the best students both in academics and sports. Some of the outstanding alumni from the sports field are international cricketers Mohinder Amarnath (Arjuna Awardee) & Maninder Singh & International Hockey Players Ashok Diwan, Harendra Singh (Dronacharya Awardee), Harish Sharma, Balbir Singh, Kuldeep Vats, Rajinder Singh, Abhay Sharma, Surinder Khanna, Prem Kashyap, Kiran Sandhu and Vijay Mala Bhanot and many more. The College is organising 11th Sahibzada Zorawar Singh & Sahibzada Fateh Singh T20 Cricket tournament in the memory of the grandsons of Ninth Guru Tegh Bahadur ji, from the 6th February to the 28th February 2025 at the College Grounds. Reputed Teams from Delhi and surrounding states are participating.





SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH


Sahibzada Zorawar Singh was the third of Guru Gobind Singh's four sons born in

November 1696 to Mata Jeeto ji. Along with his younger brother, Sahibzada Fateh Singh, he is among the most revered martyrs in the history of the Sikhs. Joint army of Mughals and hill rajas besieged Anandpur Sahib on the orders of Emperor Aurangzeb. The stock of food in the town ran out. The Mughals promised to do no harm to the Sikhs if they would hand over the fortress of Anandpur Sahib. Guru Gobind Singh agreed and left the town with his family and a small band of retainers. They had not reached very far, when the Mughals, infringing their promise, chased them. Guru Gobind entrusted his two younger sons, Zorawar Singh and Fateh Singh as well as his mother, Mata Gujri, to the care of a cook in his household named Gangu. Gangu brought Mata Gujri and the two Sahibzadas to his native village of Sahedi. Bribed by the Mughals, he turned over the three members of Guru's family to the faujdar of Marinda. They were then brought to Sirhind in the presence of Wazir Khan, the Nawab of Sirhind. The two sons of Guru Gobind Singh, Zorawar Singh (9 years old) and Fateh Singh (6 years old) were offered safe passage if they embrace Islam. On their refusal, Wazir Khan sentenced them to death and they were subsequently bricked alive.

SAHIBZADA FATEH SINGH

Sahibzada Fateh Singh was the youngest son of Guru Gobind Singh. He was born at Anandpur Sahib in December 1699. On leaving Anandpur Sahib, after having been promised safe passage to Punjab, Sahibzada Fateh Singh, along with his elder brother Zorawar Singh, was put under the care of his grandmother, Mata Gujari.

Unfortunately in the confusion of the swollen Sarsa river and an attack by Mughal pursuers, the Guru's two youngest sons and their Grandmother were separated from the main body of Sikhs. Later betrayed by the authorities of the small village where they had been given sanctuary, they were handed over to agents of Wazir Khan and carted off to Sirhind and placed under arrest in the Khan's Thanda Burj (cold tower). While the Thanda Burj was built to capture the cool night breezes of air drawn over water channels in the areas of hot summers, during the dead of winter, the unheated burj offered no comfort for the Guru's mother and sons. On 26 December 1705, Fateh Singh and his elder brother, Zorawar Singh were martyred at Sirhind. Fateh Singh is probably the youngest recorded martyr in history who knowingly laid down his life at the very tender age of 6 years. In 2022, the Government of India declared 26 of December Veer Bal Diwas, to be celebrated every year, commemorating the supreme sacrifice of the two princes.





ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT

The manner in which the two Sahibzadas' stood against injustice and discrimination has no parallels in the annals of history. The courage and fortitude of the two boys eventually became a source of inspiration for the formation of the Sikh empire on the ruins of the Mughal kingdom. They stood for what is right and against tyranny and showed what the sons of the nations are capable of. It is this spirit of standing tall against the global crises of tyranny and oppression that the T20 tournament, named after the two Sahibzadas, organised by Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, Delhi University emblemizes. Cricket is, after all, a field that encapsulates freedom and unity as players from all castes, classes, religions, and states find a single voice through the game. The sportsmanship that the game espouses ensure equity and equality; especially in the face of a few elements of the world that seek to destroy it. This tournament, as a matter of fact, has, for the past eight years, upheld such ideals and intends to continue doing so especially in line with the Viksit Bharat 2047 vision of the Indian Government. The tournament, this year, comprises of 16 teams from across the Delhi NCR and is the only one that allows the players to play under a flood light in a day/night format. Effectively, the T20 tournament fosters a camaraderie that is seldom seen outside the field; thus encouraging a feeling of brotherhood and unity among all involved.





12 TH SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH AND SAHIBZADA FATEH SINGH T20 CRICKET TOURNAMENT

7th to 29th February 2024 The Xth iteration of the Sahibzada Zorawar Singh and Sahibzada Fateh Singh T20 tournament began on the 7th of February 2024. The T20 tournament is organised annually by SGTB Khalsa College to remember and honour the memory and supreme sacrifice of the two younger sons of Guru Gobind Singh.

Since its inception in 2012, the Tournament has seen cricketers from across the nation play on the SGTB Khalsa College field. These players are from across the professional spectrum and have, historically, displayed excellent cricketing across the years. This T20 tournament is also the only one in Delhi University that allows players to play under flood lights. This year's tournament is also dedicated to the Government of India's Viksit Bharat@2047 vision. The desire to have a developed nation, fronting global affairs, is one shared by SGTB Khalsa College. The cricket tournament is thus a way to utilize the potential of the youth of the country.

The 10th Sahibzada Zorawar Singh and Sahibzada Fateh Singh T20 Cricket Tournament was organized by SGTB Khalsa college from the 7th to the 29th February 2024. 16 cricket teams, from across the Delhi NCR, were invited to compete against each other and win the 1.25 lakh rupees prize money, sponsored by the Rooprai Family, along with the championship trophy. As always, the pools of the teams were made in such a way that each team gets to play 3 league matches with at least one match under the flood lights. The tournament was inaugurated and opened by Prof. Sarita Tyagi, the Head of the Department of Physical Education & Sports Sciences of Delhi University on the 7th of February 2024. Prof. Tyagi was joined by Padmashri awardee Dr. Ravi Chaturvedi, an acclaimed international cricket commentator graced the ceremony as the Guest of Honour as well along with the esteemed (acting) principal of the college Prof. Surinder Kaur. Prof. Sarita Tyagi extolled the spirit of sportsmanship and unity emblematized by cricket as a sport and this tournament in general. After 24 intense matches through the league, 8 teams reached the quarter finals; from which 4 teams- Ravi Brothers, York's Ravindra Cricket Club, maulana Azad Cricket Academy, and Sahgal Cricket Club-reached the semifinals. Various IPL Players participated in the tournament Abhishek Sharma (IPL Hyderabad Team), Suyash (IPL KKR), Lalit Yadav (IPL Delhi Team & Indian Team), Pawan Negi (Indian Team), Yash Dhull (IPL Delhi Team & Indian Team). The two semifinal matches were held on the 27th of February

2026.





The final match, held on the 29th of February 2024, between Sahgal Cricket club and York's Ravindra Cricket Club was played under the flood lights and, after an intense sporting battle, was won by the team from Sahgal Cricket club. The Special guest of the closing ceremony, Shri Amrit Mathur, former Indian Cricket Team manager and CEO of Delhi daredevils and Shri Sanjay Bhardwaj Ex- Ranji trophy Player (Delhi) & DDCA Member officiated the prize distribution ceremony and lauded the efforts of the college in its constant commitment to uphold the cause of the sport. Aside the winner and the runner up (awarded a monetary prize of eighty thousand rupees sponsored by Goswami Ganesh Dutt Memorial Society), Rocky Nagar from Ravi Brothers was awarded the Player of the Tournament; Aditya Yadav from York's Ravindra Cricket Club, the best bowler of the tournament; Vansh Bedi from York's Ravindra Cricket Club, the best batsman; and Mayank Bansal, from Maulana Azad Cricket Academy, the best wicketkeeper. The tournament ended with a delicious dinner and the bhangra performance by the college bhangra society.

Rules of the tournament

1. The matches will be conducted on **League Cum Knock Out System**
2. The participating teams must submit a list of 16 players along with Coach and Manager together; no change of players beyond this number will be permitted throughout the tournament.
3. All the matches will be conducted on the date and time fixed by the College. Team must report 30 Minutes before the scheduled time.
4. The fixtures have been prepared considering the DDCA league matches, and the dates given by the coaches of the teams. Change in fixture won't be possible at the last minute.
5. The tournament will be governed by the latest ICC Rules for T-20 cricket.
6. Match abandoned due to inclement weather, or some any other reason will be continued on a date and time as fixed by the Organizing Committee. The Organizing Committee decision will be final and binding in case of any protest.
7. The decision of the umpire on any point during the match will be **final & binding**.
8. The State & BCCI Umpires debited through DDCA.
9. The team manager, coach and captain will be responsible for the good conduct of their players both on and off the field.
10. **The team manager & Coach must assure the kit provided by the organizing committee to the respective team member, should wear the kit throughout the tournament. Kindly maintain the decorum and essence of the game.**
11. In case of a tie in the match the decision of the winner will be decided through super over.
12. The teams will be given 3pts for winning, 1 for draw, 0 for loss.
13. Teams are requested to send their Fax no., Telephone no., Mobile no., Email so that they may be intimated well in advance.
14. **Smoking, Waping, Drinking, Tobacco Consumption is strictly prohibited in the college premises. Any team member failing to abide by the rules, the player and team will be scratched from the tournament.**
